This is risky – and one of the multidimensional aspects of Internet Addiction Disorder. Other identified multi-dimensional risk factors of Internet Addiction Disorder include physical impairments, social and functional impairments, emotional impairments, impulsive Internet use, and dependence on the Internet.

Internet Addiction Disorder - Signs, Symptoms, and Treatments

This systematic literature review outlines and discusses the current empirical literature base for clinical studies of Internet addiction and problematic Internet use. A total of 46 relevant studies on treatment seeker characteristics, psychopharmacotherapy, psychological therapy, and combined treatment were identified.

Internet addiction was also associated with reduced self-reported immune function, but not with the measure of general health (GHQ-28). This relationship between problematic internet use and reduced immune function was found to be independent of the impact of the co-morbidities.

Problematic Internet Usage and Immune Function

Two schools of thought have emerged: those authors who believe that Internet addiction merits classification as a new or emerging psychiatric disorder in its own right, and those who define certain individuals as having problematic Internet use in relation to specific online activities, such as gambling, email or pornography.

Problematic Internet use or Internet addiction ...

A systematic review in 2014 reported an association between online gaming addiction, problematic internet use (PIU), and sleep problems. The results of the study showed that pathological internet use appeared to be associated with a low sleep quality and subjective insomnia.

Problematic internet use (PIU) has been suggested as in need of further research with a view to being included as a disorder in future Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM) of the American Psychiatric Association, but lack of knowledge about the impact of internet cessation on physiological function remains a major gap in knowledge and a barrier to PIU classification.

Internet addiction early on was defined as essentially the same thing as a substance use disorder, with qualities like dependency and excessive and compulsive use. Internet Addiction: Problematic Use of the Internet and ...

Previous studies have suggested that problematic Internet use (PIU) can cause psychosocial problems, such as adolescent sleep deprivation, adverse effects on mental health including excessive stress, depression, anxiety, lack of self-esteem, and suicidal ideation [8,9,10,11].

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
