### Teach Through Play – Encourage Play

Similar to step 1 (above), we would teach the child to tolerate playing near peers, also called parallel play. Parallel play remains age-appropriate until about age four when interactive play typically emerges. Tip: Kids love trains? Build one track and have them each drive their own cars around the track. Step 5: Interactive play with peers

### 5 Steps to Teaching Play Skills

The studies examining play skills used a variety of interventions often in combination. These included: video modeling combined with reinforcement, verbal instruction, or matrix training; modelling with verbal description; restricted interests; script training; Social Stories with prompting; activity schedules; peer-mediated playgroup interventions; and

### Teaching Play Skills to Young Children with Autism

Method Empirical studies on teaching play skills to young children with autism published from 1990 to 2011 were located. These studies included single subject and group designs. Results Twenty-six studies were reviewed. The majority of studies on teaching play skills used combined interventions.

The majority of studies on teaching play skills used combined interventions. Children with autism improved their play skills, with direct intervention embedding their interests during play. Improvements in play skills increased positive social interactions and decreased inappropriate behaviour as collateral effects.

Research on directly teaching play skills demonstrates that young children with autism can acquire appropriate play behaviours. These children respond well to the play skill interventions that include modelling, prompting with contingent reinforcement, and naturalistic instruction (Lang et al., 2009).

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
